





Why Nutrition Matters and How Dietitians Can Help

March is Nutrition Month, and the theme this year is We are Dietitians – Essential Partners in Health. In this issue, we will be discussing the importance of nutrition and how a Registered Dietitian can help you achieve your health goals.

Why is Nutrition Important?

Nutrition is the science that looks at how the things we eat, and drink affect our bodies. It impacts your body's performance, ability to prevent disease, and capacity to support you as you age. Did you know, one in five Canadians lives with a chronic disease such as heart disease, cancer, or diabetes? A healthy eating pattern can help prevent and manage many chronic diseases and includes vegetables and fruit, lean meats, poultry and fish, plant-based proteins, dairy, and whole grains in your diet.





Nutrition is More Than What We Eat

Food affects physical health, but it also has an impact on spiritual and mental health. If you think of your traditions or a significant religious celebration, it is likely that food is involved in some way. As well, many people use food to heal more than just their physical being, they also use it to heal their soul or connect with others. Who Are Dietitians?

Registered Dietitians are experts in food and nutrition who work in areas such as healthcare, research, foodservice, and private sectors. Using evidence-based information, dietitians work with individuals, families, and communities to promote healthy living and tailor care plans and projects to reflect the needs of the people they serve. They help Albertans enjoy good

health, prevent and manage diseases, and recover from illness and surgery. Whether you're healing in the hospital, want to explore your relationship with food, or optimize your nutrition for sport, a Dietitian can help!

What do Registered Dietitians D	00?
Hospitals and Long-Term Care	Part of an interprofessional care team that works with patients and residents to prevent malnutrition and recover from illness or surgery.
Provincial and Federal Government	Inform our representatives about population-wide initiatives to improve overall health and wellbeing
Food Service	Manage food production in long-term care homes, hospitals, schools, restaurants, and military bases
Outpatient Clinics	Offer individual, family, or group sessions on a variety of topics. To see a Dietitian in the South Zone, visit Alberta Healthy Living Program
Community and Public Health	Promote health and prevent disease within their community through project work and programs
Private Practice	Dietitians work for a professional business to provide individual nutrition counselling, usually tailored to sports nutrition or weight management
Research	Conduct research to promote evidence-based practice that is up to date
